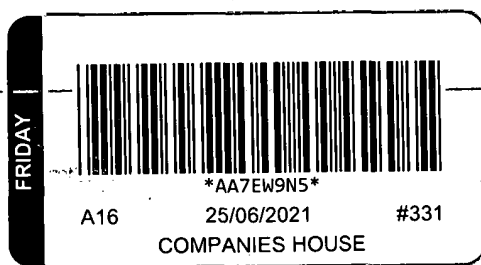

**STRATEGIC REPORT
FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2020**

The directors present their strategic report for the year ended 31 December 2020.

REVIEW OF BUSINESS

The results for the year and financial position of the company are as shown in the annexed financial statements.

The company has continued to trade as manufacturers of metal processing and fabrications. The company operates from premises in Birmingham, West Midlands, and sells its products both in the UK and overseas.

Turnover has decreased from 2019 as have production and operating costs which combined have resulted in an operating loss of £128,465 compared to an operating profit of £601,410 in the previous year. Cash generated from operations is £371,803 and overall cash has increased by £62,686 during the year. Shareholders' funds have decreased to £6,946,295 at 31 December 2020 and the directors consider that the company's position is satisfactory.

The Company will continue to use its available funds to finance other acquisitions, to grow the business.

Considering the severe impact that the global pandemic had on the business the results are considered satisfactory. The loss for the year was entirely attributable to that factor and the directors look forward to a year of progress and satisfactory trading.

PRINCIPAL RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The directors have considered the major risks and uncertainties facing the company, which include changes in legislation and regulations, loss of major customers and cash flow management, and have in place procedures to deal with these matters.

REPORT OF THE INDEPENDENT AUDITORS TO THE MEMBERS OF BIRMINGHAM STOPPER LIMITED

Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of Birmingham Stopper Limited (the 'company') for the year ended 31 December 2020 which comprise the Statement of Comprehensive Income, Balance Sheet, Statement of Changes in Equity, Cash Flow Statement and Notes to the Cash Flow Statement, Notes to the Financial Statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies. The financial reporting framework that has been applied in their preparation is applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards, including Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice).

In our opinion the financial statements:



NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS
FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2020

1. STATUTORY INFORMATION

Birmingham Stopper Limited is a private company, limited by shares, registered in England and Wales. The company's registered number and registered office address can be found on the Company Information page.

2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland" and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Turnover

Turnover represents amounts invoiced, net of value added tax, in respect of the sale of goods and services to customers.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life or, if held under a finance lease, over the lease term, whichever is the shorter.

Freehold property	- 2% on cost
Plant and machinery	- 10% on cost
Fixtures and fittings	- 20% on reducing balance
Motor vehicles	- 25% on reducing balance

Freehold land is not depreciated.

Stocks

Stocks and work in progress are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value, after making due allowance for obsolete and slow moving items. Net realisable value is based on selling price less anticipated costs to completion and selling costs.

Taxation

Taxation for the year comprises current and deferred tax. Tax is recognised in the Statement of Comprehensive Income, except to the extent that it relates to items recognised in other comprehensive income or directly in equity.

Current or deferred taxation assets and liabilities are not discounted.

Current tax is recognised at the amount of tax payable using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date.

Deferred tax

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date.

Timing differences arise from the inclusion of income and expenses in tax assessments in periods different from those in which they are recognised in financial statements. Deferred tax is measured using tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the year end and that are expected to apply to the reversal of the timing difference.

Unrelieved tax losses and other deferred tax assets are recognised only to the extent that it is probable that they will be recovered against the reversal of deferred tax liabilities or other future taxable profits.

2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES - continued

Hire purchase and leasing commitments

Assets obtained under hire purchase contracts or finance leases are capitalised in the balance sheet. Those held under hire purchase contracts are depreciated over their estimated useful lives. Those held under finance leases are depreciated over their estimated useful lives or the lease term, whichever is the shorter.

The interest element of these obligations is charged to profit or loss over the relevant period. The capital element of the future payments is treated as a liability.

Rentals paid under operating leases are charged to profit or loss on a straight line basis over the period of the lease.

Pension costs and other post-retirement benefits

The company operates a defined contribution pension scheme. Contributions payable to the company's pension scheme are charged to profit or loss in the period to which they relate.
