Undergraduate Admissions (Fall 2020)

Penn received 42,204 applications for admission to the Class of 2024. Of those applicants, 3,789, or 9 percent, were offered admission. Ninety-seven percent of the students admitted for Fall 2020 came from the top 10 percent of their high school graduating class. The middle 50% of scores, as well as the median scores, on each of the two SAT components, are as follows:

- SAT Evidence-based Reading + Writing component: 720 to 800, with a median of 750
- SAT Math component: 760 to 800, with a median of 790

Internationalism (Fall 2020)

A total of 7,830 international students applied for admission to Penn’s undergraduate schools for Fall 2020 and 474 (6.1 percent) received admissions offers. Eleven percent of the first-year class is international

Athletics and Recreation

A charter member of the Ivy League, Penn offers intercollegiate competition for men in 17 sports, including baseball, basketball, cross country, fencing, football, golf, lacrosse, heavyweight rowing, lightweight rowing, soccer, sprint football, squash, swimming and diving, tennis, indoor track, outdoor track, and wrestling. It offers intercollegiate competition for women in 16 sports, including basketball, cross country, field hockey, fencing, golf, gymnastics, lacrosse, rowing, soccer, softball, squash, swimming and diving, tennis, indoor

track, outdoor track, and volleyball. During the 2017-2018 academic year, there were 12,402 team members participating in 12 intramural leagues and 20 special events. About 1,200 students were members of 37 active club sports.

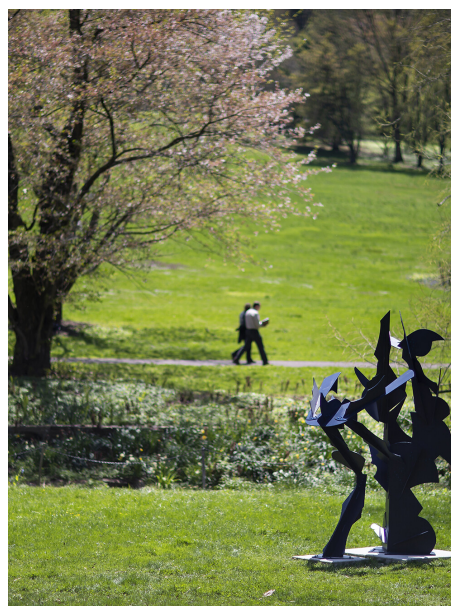
Campus Size (Fall 2020)
